

### 16 Covered Preventive Services for Adults

- Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm one-time screening for men of specified ages who have ever smoked
- Alcohol Misuse screening and counseling
- Aspirin use for men and women of certain ages
- Blood Pressure screening for all adults
- Cholesterol screening for adults of certain ages or at higher risk
- Colorectal Cancer screening for adults over 50
- <u>Depression</u> screening for adults
- Type 2 Diabetes screening for adults with high blood pressure

- Diet counseling for adults at higher risk for chronic disease
- HIV screening for all adults at higher risk
- •<u>Immunization</u> vaccines for adults--doses, recommended ages, and recommended populations vary: Hepatitis A, Hepatitis B, Herpes Zoster, Human Papillomavirus, Influenza (Flu Shot), Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Meningococcal, Pneumococcal, Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis, Varicella.
- Obesity screening and counseling for all adults
- •<u>Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI)</u> prevention counseling for adults at higher risk
- Tobacco Use screening for all adults and cessation interventions for tobacco users
- Syphilis screening for all adults at higher risk

# 22 Covered Preventive Services for Women, Including Pregnant Women

The eight new prevention-related health services marked with an asterisk (\*) must be covered with no cost-sharing in plan years starting on or after August 1, 2012.

- Anemia screening on a routine basis for pregnant women
- Bacteriuria urinary tract or other infection screening for pregnant women
- BRCA counseling about genetic testing for women at higher risk
- Breast Cancer Mammography screenings every 1 to 2 years for women over 40
- Breast Cancer Chemoprevention counseling for women at higher risk
- Breastfeeding comprehensive support and counseling from trained providers, as well as access to breastfeeding supplies, for pregnant and nursing women\*

- <u>Cervical Cancer</u> screening for sexually active women
- Chlamydia Infection screening for younger women and other women at higher risk
- Contraception: Food and Drug Administration-approved contraceptive methods, sterilization procedures, and patient education and counseling, not including abortifacient drugs\*
- <u>Domestic and interpersonal violence</u> screening and counseling for all women\*
- Folic Acid supplements for women who may become pregnant
- Gestational diabetes screening for women 24 to 28 weeks pregnant and those at high risk of developing gestational diabetes\*
- Gonorrhea screening for all women at higher risk
- Hepatitis B screening for pregnant women at their first prenatal visit

- Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) screening and counseling for sexually active women\*
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV) DNA Test: high risk HPV DNA testing every three years for women with normal cytology results who are 30 or older\*
- Osteoporosis screening for women over age 60 depending on risk factors
- Rh Incompatibility screening for all pregnant women and follow-up testing for women at higher risk
- Tobacco Use screening and interventions for all women, and expanded counseling for pregnant tobacco users
- <u>Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI)</u> counseling for sexually active women\*
- Syphilis screening for all pregnant women or other women at increased risk
- Well-woman visits to obtain recommended preventive services for women under 65\*

### 27 Covered Preventive Services for Children

- Alcohol and Drug Use assessments for adolescents
- Autism screening for children at 18 and 24 months
- •Behavioral assessments for children of all ages

Ages: <u>0 to 11 months</u>, <u>1 to 4 years</u>, <u>5 to 10 years</u>, <u>11 to 14 years</u>, <u>15 to 17 years</u>.

• Blood Pressure screening for children

Ages: <u>0 to 11 months</u>, <u>1 to 4 years</u>, <u>5 to 10 years</u>, <u>11 to 14 years</u>, <u>15 to 17 years</u>.

- <u>Cervical Dysplasia</u> screening for sexually active females
- Congenital Hypothyroidism screening for newborns
- <u>Depression</u> screening for adolescents
- <u>Developmental</u> screening for children under age 3, and surveillance throughout childhood
- **Dyslipidemia** screening for children at higher risk of lipid disorders Ages: 1 to 4 years, 5 to 10 years, 11 to 14 years, 15 to 17 years.

- Fluoride Chemoprevention supplements for children without fluoride in their water source
- Gonorrhea preventive medication for the eyes of all newborns
- Hearing screening for all newborns
- Height, Weight and Body Mass Index measurements for children

Ages: <u>0 to 11 months</u>, <u>1 to 4 years</u>, <u>5 to 10 years</u>, <u>11 to 14 years</u>, <u>15 to 17 years</u>.

- Hematocrit or Hemoglobin screening for children
- Hemoglobinopathies or sickle cell screening for newborns
- HIV screening for adolescents at higher risk
- •<u>Immunization</u> vaccines for children from birth to age 18 doses, recommended ages, and recommended populations vary:

• Iron supplements for children ages 6 to 12 months at risk for anemia

- Lead screening for children at risk of exposure
- Medical History for all children throughout development Ages: <u>0 to 11 months</u>, <u>1 to 4 years</u>, <u>5 to 10 years</u>, <u>11 to 14 years</u>, <u>15 to 17 years</u>.
- Obesity screening and counseling
- •Oral Health risk assessment for young children Ages: <u>0 to 11 months</u>, <u>1 to 4 years</u>, <u>5 to 10 years</u>.
- Phenylketonuria (PKU) screening for this genetic disorder in newborns
- <u>Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI)</u> prevention counseling and screening for adolescents at higher risk
- •**Tuberculin** testing for children at higher risk of tuberculosis Ages: <u>0 to 11 months</u>, <u>1 to 4 years</u>, <u>5 to 10 years</u>, <u>11 to 14 years</u>, <u>15 to 17 years</u>.
- Vision screening for all children

#### **Preventive Services available to Seniors (>65 years old)**

Annual Wellness Visits: If you are new to Medicare, your "Welcome to Medicare" preventive visit is now covered without cost sharing during your first 12 months of Part B coverage. This exam is a one-time review of your health as well as education and counseling about preventive services and other care. If you've had Part B for longer than 12 months, you can get a yearly wellness visit to develop or update a personalized prevention plan based on your current health and risk factors.

## **Tobacco Use Cessation Counseling:**

This benefit is now considered a covered preventive service, whether or not you have been diagnosed with an illness caused or complicated by tobacco use. While the counseling is a covered service, the co-insurance and deductible will apply if you have already been diagnosed with a tobacco related illness.

<u>Screenings</u>: No more Medicare Part B deductible or copayment for these screenings if certain coverage criteria apply:

Bone mass measurement

<u>Cervical cancer screening, including Pap smear tests and pelvic exams</u>

Cholesterol and other cardiovascular screenings

Colorectal cancer screening (except for barium enemas)

**Diabetes screening** 

Flu shot, pneumonia shot, and the hepatitis B shot

**Mammograms**
